2021-2022 Dependency Test for Federal Title IV Financial Assistance

TAKE THE 2021-2022 DEPENDENCY TEST:

This will help you to determine if you will be required to provide information from your parent(s) on your FAFSA.

Please read through and answer questions on the attached form.

If you (the student) answer "YES" to any question, you need only to report your (and spouse's, if married) 2019 income and assets on your FAFSA.

If you answer "NO" to every question, you are required to report your and your parents' 2019 income/asset information.

Additionally, you will need to document that your household is the dependent’s primary residence, the services that you provide and the dates the dependent resided with you.

The court must be located in your state of legal residence at the time the court’s decision was issued.</p>

<p>At any time on or after July 1, 2020, did your high school or school district homeless liaison determine that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or were self-supporting and at risk of being homeless?</p>	<input type="checkbox"/> YES	<input type="checkbox"/> NO	<p>Answer “Yes” if you received a determination at any time on or after July 1, 2020, that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or at risk of being homeless.</p> <p>“Homeless” means lacking fixed, regular and adequate housing, which includes living in shelters, motels or cars, or temporarily living with other people because you had nowhere else to go. “Unaccompanied” means you are not living in the physical custody of your parent or guardian. “Youth” means you are 21 years of age or younger or you are still enrolled in high school as of the day you sign this application.</p> <p>Documentation Required:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Determination from your high school or school district homeless liaison that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless. • Determination from the director of an emergency shelter or transitional housing program funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless. • Determination from the director of a runaway or homeless youth basic center or transitional living program that you were an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or were self-supporting and at risk of being homeless.
