Behavioral Excellence Coach Offerings

Observing and Reshaping Student Behavior-What's the Data and Why Does it Matter?

Audience: Teachers, assistants, paraprofessionals, support staff, administrators, and additional school personnel. Date: 1/17/2020

"I don't know what happened. It came out of nowhere." Increasingly, educators work with students with behaviors that are disruptive to their own learning and the learning environment. For educators to teach replacement behaviors, they must first identify the problem behavior and prevent it when possible. This training will help explain the importance and process for tracking specific behavior patterns in order to decrease challenging behavior. Participants will learn how to identify target behaviors, track the antecedents and consequences, and analyze data to determine the function of a specific behavior. Work time to create individual behavior tracking documents (duration, latency, frequency, and location) will be provided.

TCIS: Therapeutic Crisis Intervention for Schools

Audience: Teachers, assistants, paraprofessionals, support staff, administrators, and additional school personnel. Dates: 3/2/2020 to 3/4/2020

Therapeutic Crisis Intervention in Schools (TCIS) is a student crisis management system designed to prevent crises from occurring as well as training staff to de-escalate potential crises, effectively manage acute crises, learn constructive ways to handle stressful situations, and develop a learning circle within the organization. Participants will be trained over the course of three days in active listening, behavior support techniques, emotional first aid, crisis co-regulation, the life space interview, and the stress model of crisis. This training is available for teachers, assistants, paraprofessionals, support staff, administrators, and additional school personnel.

Active Listening

Audience: Administrators, General Education Teachers, Special Education Teachers, Teacher Assistants, School Counselors, Social Workers

Dates: 3/9/2020

Active listening serves the purpose of earning the trust of others and helping you to understand their situations. Active listening comprises both a desire to comprehend as well as to offer support and empathy to the speaker. Rather, the goal is simply for the other person to be heard, and perhaps to solve their own problems. Participants of this training will learn about the roadblocks to effective listening along with nonverbal communication techniques, as well as how to navigate difficult conversations. Participants will shift their communication from listening to respond to listening to understand.

TCIS Implementation for Leaders

Audience: Lead Evaluators who are Implementing TCIS Dates: 4/29/2020

Leaders will learn how to implement the TCIS system into their own districts in order to develop policies and procedures for 2019-2020 school year. Topics of discussion include administrative support, data and documentation, debriefing after a crisis, individual student crisis management plan development, and continuous staff training and support. Leaders will have opportunities to learn how other districts are implementing TCIS as well as troubleshoot areas of need specific to TCIS training and use.

These workshops will continue the regional work of "unwrapping" the Next Generation Standards in ELA and Math for PK-12 teachers. In smaller grade level bands, participants will closely examine the standards by developing and sequencing learning progressions. - Collaborate with colleagues from around the region to develop a common understanding of grade level standards.
- Contribute to a regional resource while developing collective teacher efficacy.

Three-Dimensional Science Standards: Secondary Teachers

An NSTA expert facilitator will help participants build a solid, shared understanding of science and engineering practices, disciplinary core ideas, and crosscutting concepts, as well as how they integrate-in short a vision of three-dimensional instruction. Participants will explore WHY the shift to three-dimensional learning and phenomenon-driven instruction is so critical, while also engaging with high-quality examples and materials though hands-on immersion and via a connection to one classroom. Participants will engage in professional learning using high-quality instructional materials paired with a powerful toolkit of resources to implement the three-dimensional learning centered on phenomena and design solutions in the classroom. Facilitators will model instructional strategies and use of curricular materials consistent with the innovations in A Framework for K-12 Science Education. All participants will receive The NSTA Quick-Reference Guide to the NGSS, K-12, edited by Ted Willard.

The first workshop will be a half day of face-to-face instruction in the afternoon on March 20th. Two follow up 90 minute webinars will take place at a date and time to be determined by the districts/participants.
