Cayuga County Health Department Quarantine Guidelines for School Districts

Important Considerations:

- The Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) defines a close contact as 6 ft. x 15 minutes with or without mask.
- In K-12 setting, social distancing is reduced to 3ft. for students indoors, but remains at 6 ft. for staff.
- Strict adherence to mask wearing among students, teachers and school staff and physical distancing will diminish the number of individuals put in quarantine should they be exposed to a positive person.
- Mask breaks are not to occur in the classroom setting unless greater than 6 feet social distance can be maintained.
- Contact investigation and tracing is reliant on accurate classroom attendance records and seating charts, student/teacher schedules, cafeteria seating charts, and bus student seat rosters.
- Positive persons will be placed into isolation regardless of vaccination status and symptoms.
- A laboratory confirmed COVID-19 positive person is considered infectious during the period of **2 days** prior to onset of symptoms or **2 days** prior to a positive test result
- Individuals are exempt from quarantine should they be exposed to a positive person if they have tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 90 days <u>and</u> has remained symptom free since the current COVID-19 exposure <u>or</u> if a person is fully vaccinated (greater than 2 weeks following receipt of the last dose of the series) <u>and</u> has remained symptom-free since the current COVID-19 exposure.
- The Health Department will make final decisions as related to quarantine for school community members after finalizing the contact investigation of a positive person/s. The Health Department will be monitoring illness in schools and will take action accordingly.
